INDUSTRY ADVISORY BOARD | SCOPE OF WORK

Industry Advisory Board

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The Industry Advisory Board (hereafter: the IAB) is designed to act as an external consultative group for the “Student-Run Interdisciplinary Allied Health Digital Practice Centre” (hereafter: SIAHDPC) partners, especially.

The aim of the IAB is to mitigate the mismatch between the demanded competences by the current and future industries and their supply by the academic and professional competence development institutions in Kosovo, especially.

The IAB is primarily expected to contribute towards these objectives:

- Consult, review, and identify ways how to better the quality of services being offered by the SIAHDPC Center
- Identify current and prospective trends in terms of professional needs of health professionals in Kosovo and beyond
- Contribute in co-creating and co-delivering relevant professional trainings
- Support the SIAHDPC partners develop alternative solutions in healthcare and technology sector in Kosovo and beyond
- Advocate for the improvement of the sector by articulating the needs that stem from the industry and utilizing them to influence institutional stakeholders in the formulation of new policies.

In order to help this team, operationalize the respective goals, the Project Consortium has been able to draft the following proposals for the members of the IAB:



1. The IAB is led by a Chair and Vice-Chair, both of whom serve one-year terms. The Chair of the Board is from HC, whereas the Vice-Chair may be any member from the industry.
2. There will be no limit to the number of board members, however, the Board will aim to have as many industry leaders as possible and intends to ensure a balanced gender representation. Every board member serves a two-year term and terms can be renewed indefinitely. Members do not necessarily have to be incorporated in Kosovo, but rather have an incentive to participate in the Kosovo market. Board members are encouraged to suggest new members.
3. The IAB meets online in March and September of every year. Every member reserves the right to call a meeting. Face to face meetings are preferable but depend on the members capacities and willingness.
4. The IAB members are encouraged to consult the SIAHDPC Centre regarding all of its activities, in the domain of health, entrepreneurship and policy-advocating.
5. The Chair and Vice Chair of the Board are going to operationalize any initiatives and/or requests that will be formulated in the meetings. They will aim to do so by involving as many members as possible, including by forming different working groups.
6. The Board will have a secretary from the College's senior staff, that will inform the members on the progress of the initiatives and, when necessary, coordinate meetings and other activities between the members. The secretary is going to keep the meeting minutes and propose an agenda for the next meeting.
